21. Apologies

Clive Charlton was unable to attend the meeting.

22. Matters arising from the minutes from the meeting held on 1st December

The minutes were accepted as read.

Peter Crozier has opened a bank account with Lloyds Bank for the Jubilee funds.

23. Further discussion and scheduling of the Jubilee weekend.

Updates were given on events and the schedule were updated accordingly.

The Platinum Jubilee Beacon - A local blacksmith is making a 6-foot beacon with a basket tower. Possible location would be the Bowling Club, as you might be able to see beacons from other towns/villages. Need to ensure the local Fire Brigade are informed of its lighting.
